
Rhythm For a Christian's Life

In his book, The Rhythm of Life: Living Every Day with Passion and Purpose, Matthew Kelly wrote, "The glory of God is the perfection of the creature. There is no better way to honor life and God than to strive to become the best version of yourself." His point is clear. The best way for us to give glory to God, as followers of Christ, is to be intentional in embracing a life that will lead us in becoming the person, and the people, that He created us to be. And that perfect life, full of joy and peace and purpose, is to be with God.

"Drawing close to God takes a life choice and a plan for our journey in getting there."

The intentionality that we seek can be outlined within a rhythm for our ongoing lives that serves to help us "Draw near to God to make and equip disciples and to live as faithful followers of Christ." Once we have drawn up close to God, the actions of that life become second nature...really first nature, as they should be. But as we are getting there it takes a life

choice and a plan for our journey in getting there.





to discuss and develop a suggested rhythm for our lives at Redeemer that will serve to bring us into the relationship with God that God desires. We came to understand that a Rhythm for Our Christian Life is both a choice we make and a minimum pattern for our Christian journey so that, by embracing one, we move closer and closer to God. It is then, through that deeper, more authentic, relationship with our Creator, we become who we say we desire to be.

The Rhythm for Life that is being offered now to each of us includes the following six disciplines which we hope all of us will receive and embrace faithfully for our journey together.

1. Pray Daily. It is unreasonable to think that we can draw near to God if we do not endeavor to have an ongoing, daily, relationship with Him. Daily prayer is essential in this relationship. From the time we rise in the morning and put the day ahead into His hands until we





Noteworthy....

If you are 70½ or older, let the IRS donate to Redeemer.

You may be aware of this already, a relatively new provision has been made permanent.

You can donate any of your withdrawals from your IRA to your favorite recognized charity (Church of the Redeemer, Samaritan House, Pleasant Vallev Connection, etc) TAX FREE. This includes the mandatory dispersal after age 70 ½. You will have to fill out an extra form and have the money issued directly to the charity. But then you see directly the full benefit of your savings, without losing 25 % or more to benefit the nation.

Check with your tax advisor on limitations as to the type of IRA and the amounts of donation possible.


