From The Senior Warden

We are now in Advent, the beginning of the Church calendar, but for me it's difficult not to think of this time as one of things coming to an end. As we approach the close of another year, one's mind invariably turns to certain things ... memories of the past year ... what's in store for next year... football playoffs!

We should all feel good about the year we have had at Redeemer. We were thrown a bit of a curve ball not too far into the year, when we learned that our Rector would be leaving us for a different calling in Montana. This was not something that any of us expected, including Father Scott. But we handled his departure with love and mutual encouragement, and stepped onto our path forward without any regret over the fact that we were now being called as a congregation to start a new journey. God was with us, blessing us with a wonderful interim priest and a renewed sense of energy for making Redeemer better.

What is particularly gratifying is how so many people have stepped up to keep Redeemer moving forward. Because of the hard work of many of our parishioners, we had our second, inspiring Summer of Service and our first ever bicycle rodeo, a successful yard sale, movie night at the Pumpkin Patch, pumpkin sales of over \$16,000 that raised nearly \$6,000 in donations for Samaritan House, Mother Teresa House, and the Pleasant Valley Connection, and a Halloween Trunk or Treat that provided a safe and fun

night for over 100 neighborhood kids. Redeemer became the only church in our diocese to have a Junior Daughters of the King chapter, and we hosted a joint assembly of the Daughters of the King and Episcopal Church Women. Substantial time and work have gone into fixing up and beautifying our buildings and grounds. We've enjoyed great fellowship events together, like our Lunch 'n' Learn in May, lemonade and ice cream on the lawn during the summer, Holy Chow brunches, and this Sunday, our annual Christmas We had a very thoughtprovoking Adult Sunday School program with a discussion of the book, "Toxic Charity," culminating with visits with representatives of the three local charities mentioned above to discuss with us how we can best support the great work they are doing in our community.

In addition to all this, every week we have experienced beautiful and moving church services as a result of the dedication and hard work of our choir, altar guild, flower guild, greeters, ushers, vergers, lectors, and acolytes. And Father Mark continues to be an inspiration and blessing to us.

So there is much to be proud of, and thankful for, as this year at Redeemer comes to a close.

And much is in store for the coming year. In January we will be hosting a Sunday brunch and presentation by representatives of One Collective, the missionary organization that has



Dog in the Manger

By Episcopal priest Tim Schenck



This Advent Season we will be reading and discussing this marvelous book by Father Tim Schenck. His humor infuses this short read and it is highlighted by illustrations from another priest, Jay Sidebotham. You will see yourself in his descriptions of the pre-Christmas distractions that lead us astray from the meaning of Christmas.

Here is a quote by Father Tim in the Forward.

"Our faith is a gift, but it isn't a perfectly wrapped present with exact folds or precisely tied bow. It is more like the way I wrap. Fortunately faith isn't about being neat and tidy. You may burn the Christmas roast, Santa may not bring your child exactly what she wanted, you might even get sick and miss out on the best party of the year. But through it all, God remains."

Our discussions in Adult Sunday School on this book will help revive the source of our Joy in preparing for this Christmas. Join us on December 9, 16, & 23 after service.

The first chapter is entitled Preparing the Way. (Subtitle "I can't wait"). The book will be available in the Transept on Sunday, December 2, so you can read the first chapter. That Sunday you can light your first Advent

candle after you make your wreath during Sunday School. The cost is \$10 or less if you have already exceeded your Christmas budget. Leave the money or check (payable to Rick Hankinson) in the container next to the books.

Gary Powell in the Ukraine



Please keep our missionary Gary Powell in your prayers. He is in the Ukraine sharing the Gospel with the Ukrainian people. Included here is an email Bill Lee received from Gary and some photos of Gary with the Ukrainian people.

Greetings from a chilly Ukraine. I am getting a taste of the change in seasons here which I did not have in Thailand. It gets down to the mid 30's at night with the daytime temps in the mid 50. It is actually one of the warmer parts of the country since we have the Transcarpathian mountains buffering the cold. It is much colder say in Kiev or Lviv in the central part of the country. I am sure using all the heavy coats and sweaters people gave me.

I have been in the Roma camps the past few days meeting with the Roma pastors in each camp and gave them the knitting to give out to the neediest people. I was advised to go through the Roma churches and the pastors I have established contact with to help with the knitting. I have to be careful on my approach with this culture group and always go with one of the Romas that are known in each camp as well as my interpreter. Even though I have been seen in each of the camps and go into their homes, it could be dangerous for me to into the camps alone.

I can not describe what doors God has opened up for me in going into the homes. My interpreter who is known throughout the camps took some pictures of several camps and me giving out some of the knitting. I don't take pictures as there has been



problems in the past with foreigners taking pictures. Several of the pictures show the desperate condition of the camps.

Another reason I am writing is to ask for your

prayers and Redeemers prayers for guidance and safety. I have a trip scheduled to the East of the country on the front lines of the ongoing war with Russia. I will be



going with my Ukrainian pastor from December 4 to December 11. Traveling by train to Kiev and then to a city on the front lines.



I had to first get permission from my team leader to go into the war zone because the Russians had been bombing the city, but the Ukrainian army pushed the Russians back and the bombing has stopped and it is relatively safe. I will be joining a young lady working with youth in the war area. I am

going to provide any support they need and provide prayer support. This is not something I immediately decided to do. God put it on my heart to go but I put it on the shelf to pray about because I wanted to get further confirmation this was God led and not my idea. I hope that I will be able to share Christ's love to these young people.

I hope that this note finds you and Patty doing well. Please share my prayer requests as you can. Let me hear from you when you get a chance.




