From The Senior Warden

As we are reminded by Christmas, God is constantly surprising us. The Messiah comes, not as an earthly ruler, not as a mighty warrior, but as a child in a manger. The witnesses are not Roman rulers and generals, nor priests and leaders of the Jewish nation, but poor shepherds and a few wandering foreigners. Jesus's whole earthly life consisted of a series of acts and teachings that defied expectations and caught people – both his followers and his enemies – off guard.

God continues to surprise us. Sometimes those surprises are positive, even miraculous, and we rejoice in them. Other times those surprises upset our carefully crafted plans.

We at Redeemer had to deal with a big surprise last spring. It was not what I would have wished for at the beginning of the year, and yet God transformed it into a meaningful and beneficial experience for us. It quickly became clear that the Holy Spirit was with us as we journeyed along our new path. Many, many people stepped up There seemed to be a to help. newfound sense of joy and fellowship in our gatherings. Folks we had not seen for a while started coming back to church. Being temporarily without a rector became a catalyst for creativity, change, and improvement.

Recently we have been presented with another surprise, Charles Owings, our organist and music director, will be moving on to First Methodist Church of Laurens. We will begin the search for an organist soon and keep you updated. Again, it is not what I would have wished for, but again I have no doubt that it will be a good and positive change for us and for Charles. We wish him the best.

As we celebrate the beginning of a new year, the challenge for us is to carry throughout the year our ability to be surprised by what God is doing and to allow God to use us to surprise the world. We make God known by doing God's work in the world. We continue to have vital partnerships with Mother Teresa House, the Pleasant Valley Connection, and Samaritan House, and we hope to strengthen and build upon those partnerships this year. As a community, we are growing how we share Christ with the world around us.

Epiphany is a good time to meditate on the mystery of God coming to dwell with us and what that means for us as disciples of Jesus. It reminds us of the work to be done. There's a poem called "The Work of Christmas" by Howard Thurman, an African-American theologian, educator, and civil rights leader, that has fitting words for this time of the year:

When the song of the angels is stilled, When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and princes are home, When the shepherds are back with their flock, The work of Christmas begins: To find the lost, Continued on page 2



2019 Vestry Information



The Episcopal Church Canons allow a church that is without a rector to ask the Bishop to allow the outgoing vestry or wardens to stay in office past the end of their term until a new rector is called.

At the November meeting the Vestry adopted a resolution to make this request of the Bishop. Through an email to Rev. d'Rue Hazel we have received permission from Bishop Waldo for Wallace Lightsey to stay on as the Vestry Senior Warden, and Stephany Austell to stay on as the Vestry Junior Warden. They will stay on in

their current positions until a Rector is chosen.

Father Mark's Remarks

Perhaps it is living in the "Information Age" that leads one to the fallacy that "wisdom" is comprised solely of accumulated informational knowledge. It is not! Wise thinking is so much more than processing bits of information. Real thinking may



include concepts such as reason, logic, philosophy, prudence, discernment, insight and even belief, hope and faith. We read early in the Proverbs of Solomon that, "Fear (sovereign respect) of the Lord is the beginning of all wisdom." An awareness of humankind's subordination to a higher power brings great insight to the knowledge we do accumulate. It brings even more insight to the knowledge we don't possess, for we understand far less about our universe than we know to be scientific fact. T.S. Eliot wrote:

> "The endless cycle of idea and action, Endless invention, endless experiment, Brings knowledge of motion, but not of stillness:

Knowledge of speech, but not of silence; Knowledge of words, and ignorance of the Word.

All our knowledge brings us nearer to our ignorance,

All our ignorance brings us nearer to death.

But nearness to death not nearer to God. Where is the Life we have lost in living? Where is the wisdom we have lost in knowledge?

Where is the knowledge we have lost in information?

The cycles of Heaven in twenty centuries

Bring us farther from God and nearer to the Dust."

Let us not just be God's thinking people; let us be God's wise and thinking people.




