

Christian Education

I've been thinking a lot about different seasons lately. Maybe it's because I am getting older and it is just a natural progression of life. Looking back at my article from this time last year, our church was in the season of a new rector search. We were in the process of many changes. Much physical groundwork was being laid, while we prayerfully waited for God to show us our next season here at Redeemer. His plan is unfolding as we get ready to welcome Reverend Catherine Tatem to our Redeemer family. I am truly looking forward to getting to know Rev. Catherine and working with her in ministry together.

A Plea for Help...

August is the busy season of planning for youth Sunday school classes and activities for the fall. To be honest, your help is desperately needed to make it all happen! There are 3 classes that will be offered for the ages of children we will have in the fall. Sanctus (grades K-5), Hands of God (grades 6-8), and The Dove's Nest (grades 9-12.) Each class should have 2 teachers per Safe Church guidelines, so a lot of volunteers are needed!

Teaching or assisting with Sunday school is not a huge time commitment. The more volunteers we have the less you teach. It would be great to have 8 volunteers per class, that way you only teach once a month. Our Sunday school year runs September through May. That's only 8 months out of the year, and doesn't include the holidays when there is no class. Most other denominations teach Sunday school the entire year and the same person teaches every week! You do not need any prior experience in teaching. The lessons are sent to you ahead of time for you to look over at your convenience. Everything is set up in the classroom and ready to go before you arrive on Sunday morning.

Finally, one of the best reasons to volunteer is getting to know the kids and helping them grow in their faith. Most of the time they

teach you more about life and love than you teach them. It would be such a shame and a great loss for all of us to be unable to offer a Christian education program for the youth of Redeemer because we don't have enough volunteers.

It is often said, that the youth are the future of the church. While that is very true, I think we should focus on the fact that: the children and the older youth of the church are our Present!

It is extremely vital for the life of the church that the youth are lifted and equipped to receive Christ's blessings and spread the love and promise of The Good News to others!

Make the commitment to make church and the youth of Redeemer a priority and be here often. Did you know that almost every reference of "church" in the New Testament is about the local church? Local church is defined as a group of Christians who have promised together, to gather regularly for worship in ministry. We are all nourished when we gather in His name through corporate worship, Bible studies, and church ministries.

God has given each of us spiritual gifts. If you know what your gifts are, then let's get fired up and use them! If you are like me and are still trying to figure out what your gifts are, let us help one another to discover what those gifts are and how to use them to glorify the Lord!!

"And his gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, for the equipment of the saints, for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ."

Ephesians 4:11-12

Everyone will agree that when something is asked of our parishioners, it has always been provided. Please prayerfully consider sharing your time this year with the youth at Redeemer. I know it will be a great year and I am looking forward to all this next season has to offer us.

Help Wanted!



ALWAYS REMAIN THANKFUL

We have many things to be thankful for these days at Redeemer. We have been blessed with Father Mark & his ministry to us. Our wardens & vestry members have continued their strong lay leadership & our search committee brought us a wonderful new rector. We also can continue to give thanks for all or our blessings by with our daily prayers and the coins placed in your Blue Box which will go to support the United Thank Offering 2020 Grants. We will soon have our Fall Ingathering, but our diocese was blessed with three 2019 grant awards.

The first two involve service by two young women here in Greenville. Courtney Watson received a \$4000.00 Young Adult Grant -Textile Village Servant Corps. This will be a service based intentional community in Greenville for 20-29 year olds looking for a year of personal discernment, community immersion & spiritual formation. Grants - UTO in Partnership with Jasmine Road and Diocese of Upper SC for a Julia Chester Emery Internship in the amount of \$35,000.00. Isabelle Watkins, a graduate of Furman University, began her internship July 1 at Jasmine Road a UTO Grant Site which is a home dedicated to getting women suffering from sexual trafficking & abuse in many forms back on their feet. She will assist the Residential Service Coordinator in ensuring all activities promote the residents recovery & overall mission of Jasmine Road.

We had many so many of you who lifted up their prayers & coins at our Spring Ingathering. We were able to send \$713.74 which will go towards the 2020 UTO Granting Period. Please continue to use the discipline of sending up your daily prayers for you many blessings & dropping your coins in your Blue Box as we approach our **September 28** Ingathering. UTO Boxes & other additional information are available in the Information Center.

LOOSE OFFERING HELPING EDUCATION

Last fall, at the 96th Diocesan Convention the body voted to designate the last Sunday in August as the suggested date that all congregations would dedicate their loose plate offering to the Bena Dial Scholarship Fund. In 1926, Mrs. George I. (Bena) Dial was chairman of the Ladies Auxiliary's Department of Religious Education subcommittee.

She quickly moved beyond her role of keeping in contact with "our own college students" into recognizing the need to gather information concerning the financial needs of these students. The Ladies Auxiliary established that same year a fund in her name to help "worthy girls in our diocese to secure an education".

Our Episcopal Church Women have continued to support this fund in its many forms since 1926. Currently, applicants, both female & male, are chosen from rising seniors, current college & technical students, seminarians, and graduate students. The amount of the scholarship & how many are awarded is dependent on the donations received from each parish. Redeemer recipients included Gloria Suarez who was able to complete her MBA with the help of the money she received.

Redeemer will send the loose offering taken in Sunday, August 18 to the Bena Dial Scholarship Fund. This will go along with a Sunday in which we will bless not only our student's book bags, but also our teachers both our Redeemer Sunday School teachers and those who teach in public arena.

LEARN ABOUT AND SUPPORT SAMARITAN HOUSE A COR OUTREACH PROJECT

Samaritan House is a charity that The Church of the Redeemer has supported for many years. It is a food bank that provides food for families in and around The the Church οf Redeemer neighborhood including folks in



Pleasant Valley and those in Greenville County in need of nutritional support.

On Sunday, August 4, Redeemer's service will provide information about the services and goals of Samaritan House. One critical need coming rapidly down the pike is having to move from their current location at Augusta Heights Baptist Church, just around the corner from COR. Up to this point, Augusta Heights Baptist has allowed Samaritan's food bank to operate out of a 900-square foot building at no charge. AHBC is selling off that portion of their property to a developer for housing that is not considered "affordable housing."

Food to hand out to needy clients is collected in a variety of ways, most from the USDA A powerful way to acquire food is surplus. Samaritan House's ability to purchase donated food through Harvest Hope at \$0.19/lb. That makes cash a powerful tool. Other food comes through our own collections that call for canned tomatoes, beans, corn, or other common foods. Clients can visit the food bank now twice a month and leave with varying amounts depending on family size.

On August 4th, please plan to join us and bring a donation of one- or two-pound bags of rice that will help fill a need within the food pantry, as well as hear Executive Director, Steve Fior discuss the mission of Samaritan House. Remember also that the Fourth is a first Sunday of the month and one half of the loose money in the plate goes into the Rector's Discretionary Fund and the other half to our outreach mission.

Most importantly, if you are able to offer suggestions for relocation of Samaritan House (preferring 1,000 square feet or more) at little or no cost, please pass along that information to Rick Hankinson. Prayers are needed to keep the worthwhile mission of Samaritan House alive.




