First Lesson

Jeremiah 23:1-6

He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

The Holy Gospel

Luke 23:33-43

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ According to Luke.

People: *Glory to you, Lord Christ.*

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. The people stood by, watching Jesus on the cross; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews." One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

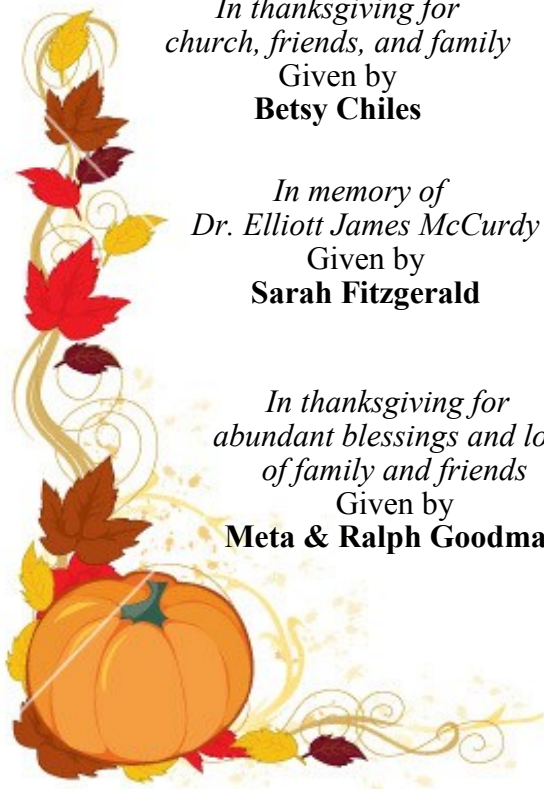

The Color of Waiting

Advent is the beginning of the Church Year for most churches in Western tradition. It begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, which is the Sunday nearest November 30th, and ends on Christmas Eve, December 24th. In 2019, Advent begins on Sunday, December 1.

The focus of the Advent season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. The traditions of Advent include the color of dark "royal" purple or Sarum blue (from the Medieval Sarum rite). Both symbolize preparation, penitence, and royalty to welcome the new King. The shade of purple used in Advent is also the color of suffering used during Lent and Holy Week, pointing to an important connection between Jesus' birth and death. Sarum blue, which Redeemer is using this year, points to a distinction between Advent and Lent, pointing to Advent's emphasis on hope and expectant waiting.
