Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

To borrow the words of our Bishop, the Rt. Rev. Andrew Waldo, "Church cannot be 'canceled.' The Body of Christ cannot be reduced to where we go and what we do on Sundays. In moments like this," one of pandemic, now declared to be a national state of emergency, "we are still called to be the Church." After prayer and much consideration, I have made the decision to suspend in-person worship services and activities from today, March 14, 2020, through Sunday, March 22, 2020. I will keep you updated of any changes beyond that date.

This decision comes with consideration that our job as people of faith is to protect the vulnerable; at this time that includes our efforts to slow down the progression of Coronavirus infections. My decision also comes with a deep longing to be together, in person, again. For now, we can and will be together in prayer and in contact via telephone, social media, on-line meetings and gatherings, and in other corporate, perhaps non-visible ways.

For worship on Sunday, March 15, I invite and encourage you to join in the 11:00 a.m. live-streamed celebration of the Holy Eucharist with our National Cathedral. The sermon, "Is there any message in this mess?" will be delivered by our Presiding Bishop, the Most Rev. Michael Curry. In part, +Michael's words remind us that worship:

"On the mountain top or in the church building isn't important. In spirit and in truth is what matters. So on livestreams or in a church building, all that matters is to worship God in spirit and truth."
