## From The Rector

### Launching a Missionary

Has your heart ever ached for someone in terrible need? Have you ever found yourself in the gap where your life intersected with others in a way that enabled you to show God's love in a concrete way? Have you ever felt the need to respond to God's prompting to be God's loving presence for those in deep struggle? These, and so much more, describe the life and calling of a Christian Missionary. It is a calling that stirs in the lives of so many faithful Christians within our troubled world. It is Christ's desire for us, as faithful followers, as He directs us into the lives of those He wishes to be able to experience His active presence in the dark world in which they find themselves.

And how many of us, in the midst of this stirring in our hearts, find ourselves, because of our varying situations and commitments, unable to respond by packing up our lives and going to stand in the breach in order to impact lives in a faraway place? Most of us, I would guess.

At The Church of the Redeemer God has given each of us

the opportunity to live into the missionary call, even if our personal life circumstances block our moving to a foreign land.

We are being given the chance to draw along side the missionary that God has raised up from our midst, and has given the heart, and the dedication, and the circumstances to apply God's love through The Church of the Redeemer for the sake of the refugees of war in the Ukraine.

Gary Powell has responded to the missionary's call for many years. His work has taken him to Mexico, India, Africa, and Thailand. For all his service he has utilized the many blessings that God has sent his way, in order to self-fund God's mission though the work he has accepted. And now, after over three and one half years of service in Thailand, and many more years of preparation within the missionary field, God is moving Gary to bring God's love to those displaced by war in the Ukraine with a group called International Team Missions (ITeams). And we have the

### From the Senior Warden

Although this article will appear in the February issue of *Echoes*, I am writing it in January, which seems like an appropriate time to reflect on the past year and cast our minds ahead to the coming year. January bears the name of the Roman god, Janus, who is depicted with two faces – one looking backward and the other looking forward – a reminder of how we start a new year looking back on the past and anticipating the future.

2017 was a good year for Redeemer. We ended the year with a budget surplus, no debt, more than adequate reserves, and in strong financial condition. Betty Boesch completed her second consecutive year as Senior Warden (surely there is a sainthood for her in store!), and under her leadership a number of important capital improvements were made, including the purchase and installation of our new organ. The “Shift” program conducted last spring generated lively and soul-searching conversations about our roles as disciples of Jesus Christ and sacred partners to each other, and culminated in the formulation of a “Rhythm for Life” through the Advent discussions at the end of the year. If you have not already read this “Rhythm for Life,” I urge you to do so – a number of people at Redeemer have told me that they found it very meaningful – and we should all consider putting it into practice in our day to day lives.

Last summer, Lori Hawkins and our Christian education leaders decided to experiment with a “Summer of Service,” or “S.O.S.,” rather than the traditional vacation bible school. This new idea involved the children, older youth, and a number of adults at Redeemer in helping out for a week at several different ministries in Greenville, including Serenity Place, United Ministries, and Samaritan House. Each day the group met at a different location, got a tour of what the particular organization does for our community, and participated in an outreach project for that organization. S.O.S. was a great success and received widespread recognition

within our Diocese as an innovative alternative to vacation bible school.



These are just a few highlights. In addition, our ongoing ministries such as outreach, pastoral care, Christian education, stewardship, fellowship, Daughters of the King, altar guild, flower guild, music and choir, men’s and women’s study groups, and others continued their great work. For a church our size, Redeemer has a lot going on, an amazing energy and spiritual vitality!

Looking ahead to the coming year, the Vestry met on January 12 and 13 to discuss our goals and objectives for 2018. You will be hearing more about this in the months to come, but areas of emphasis will include strengthening and growing our youth programs, increasing our church family, and expanding educational opportunities for members and guests. Your ideas and suggestions are both welcome and needed! At our retreat, the Vestry discussed its role in the church, and a word that came up several times was, “listen.” We are here for you and will be glad to receive any thoughts that you would like to share with us. If you have a suggestion for a particular area, the following are the commission assignments that have been accepted by the current Vestry members:

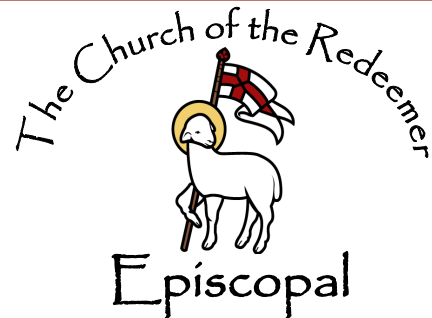

opportunity and the privilege to embrace this ministry with Gary.

In order to launch Gary's ministry in the Ukraine, a one-time investment must be raised in the amount of \$9,105.00. This amount will cover travel and visa expenses, initial one-time home setup, language school in the Ukraine, ITeams training and support for the mission launch, and other necessary incidentals. In order to come along side of Gary in God's call for his life, Redeemer has established a fund to cover these one-time costs. Also, in order to help fund this effort, a generous donor has offered a dollar-for-dollar matching grant for the first \$4,000 raised. This will double any donation that each of us would be willing to make to launch this important work.

In addition to this one-time mission investment, although Gary has dedicated all of his retirement income (Social Security and Pension) to self-fund his ministry, due to the higher cost of living in the Ukraine he is not able to fully cover his ongoing, monthly living and mission expenses. This shortfall is approximately \$650 (\$300 in living

expenses and \$350 in mission expenses). The Vestry at Redeemer has committed to meet the \$300 monthly personal living shortfall from our Extended Missions budget. As a result, only the ongoing monthly financial commitment of \$350 is needed from individuals willing to pull together to embrace this mission with Gary by covering the cost of the mission work that Gary is unable to self-fund.

I hope that you will consider being part of this mission. If you can commit to help fund the launch and/or support the ongoing mission, you can send your donation, or pledge of support to The Church of the Redeemer with "Ukraine Mission" in the memo line. Your gift will not only go far in helping the victims of war, but I have no doubt that it will also bring joy to your life and life to our church.

Thank you for being God's face in the world.

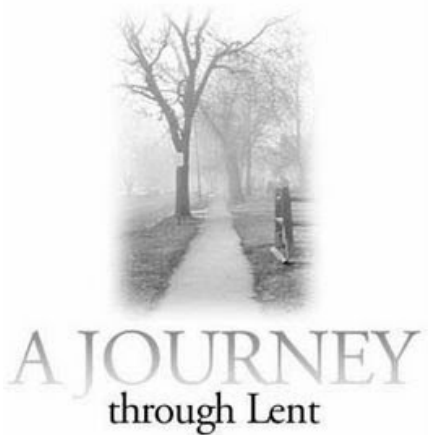

## Gary Powell

### The Church of the Redeemer's Missionary to the Ukraine

I want to tell you about the amazing journey God has mapped out for me that will enable me to be the hands and feet of Jesus.

Little did I know it at the time, but my journey began when I joined The Church of the Redeemer mission team that traveled to rural Mexico to work at an orphanage by the name of Casa Hogar La Familia. This experience with the mission team in Mexico led me to seek mission trip opportunities in both India and Africa.

Then 3-1/2 years ago I moved to Thailand to work with Pakistani and Sri Lankan Christian refugees who are fleeing persecution for their belief in Jesus. They are an amazing testimony to their faith in God. My work in Thailand and the commitment I observed among the refugees I worked with inspired me and gave me the passion to commit to working as a missionary for as long as I am able.

I do not think life is a coincidence. I believe God plans each of our journeys in life and puts us where He wants us. My foundation in God's word and my purpose in life continued to grow with the time I spent in Asia.

God's path led me to an organization called International Teams Mission (ITeams). This is a group of Christians who are totally focused on Jesus Christ and work throughout the world with the under privileged, the forgotten and the persecuted. ITeams goal is to see to it that no one is invisible, and everyone has access to food, freedom and forgiveness. With Jesus and with each other, I know in my heart we can make life better for these refugees.

I will be serving in a city in the southwestern part of the Ukraine working with refugees who are called "internally displaced" people which means that many of them – along with other persecuted people — are victims of the ongoing war in Crimea. I will be specifically assigned to work with Roma Gypsies living in camps outside the city.

Christ told his followers, "come see, follow me". I am asking you to join me in my walk with Christ and to be a part of this journey to show the love of Jesus. As part of ITeams, I am choosing to live in a way that reflects Jesus. And you can too. One way you can is to help fund my ministry in the Ukraine. I would enjoy an opportunity to meet with you, answer any questions you may have about my work as a missionary and ask you to prayerfully consider helping me financially to travel to the Ukraine and begin doing the work God has called me to do. I am looking for any amount of funding — no amount is too small — that will enable me to answer God's call. All I need is enough funding to cover the cost to travel to the Ukraine, the cost of doing my work with the refugees and the cost to live modestly. I have already pledged 100% of my social security and my pension to partially cover my expenses.

Thank you for joining me in mission.

While totally dependent on church and other donor funding to cover operations costs, the mission of Mother Teresa House is to provide a safe space where residents of the communities can come for direct help in the areas of emergency food assistance, nursing-based medical care with some physician participation, and telephonic referral to other Greenville agencies offering a large variety to the poor and the disadvantaged. Our goal is to increase the hours of operation as the demand for the services increases.

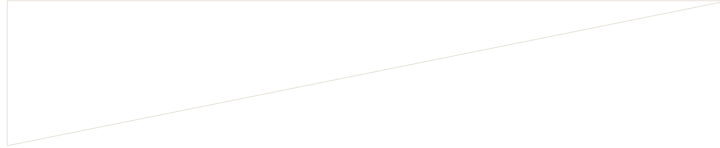

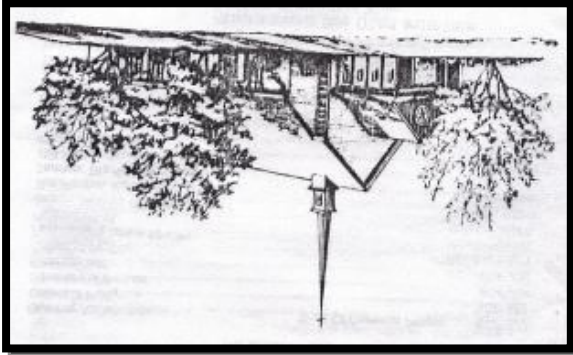
