A Journey for the Risen Christ



You might remember the story how one day Jesus decided to take a walk on the beach on the Sea of Galilee. As he walked he came upon some fishermen. Peter and Andrew were throwing their nets in an attempt to increase their catch for the day. John and James were mending their nets with their father. He called to them all and they immediately, as St. Mark would say, dropped what they were doing and followed.

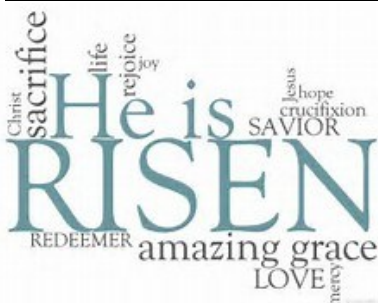
Some would say that what happened on that beach was spontaneous, sort of like being at the right place at the right time. An unknown individual, unknown at least to those on that shore, went down to the lake and saw some strapping young men and said, "You look like good, capable workers. Come with me, I have some things out in the world to take care of."

I have a hunch, however, that maybe Peter and the others knew, or knew of, Jesus before they encountered him on the beach. The talk was assuredly starting, even though his ministry was just beginning. He had been publicly baptized in the Jordan by John, who was recognized to be a

prophet by many in that day. John said at that time that this guy was the one who should be baptizing him and that later he would be the one who would be doing the baptizing, but his baptism would be with fire and the Spirit instead of water. As a matter of fact, he was so special that John said that he was not even worthy to untie the straps of his sandals.

What became obvious for them on that day was that calling is more than an invitation to an action. It is more than an offer of a new career path. Jesus said, "Follow me" not come and do. Calling is an encounter with Christ. Yes, there would be doing. They would fish for people. But first and foremost, when Peter, and Andrew, and James, and John embarked to embrace their calling, they embarked to embrace Jesus instead of a specific job description. They were following a unique person to places unknown for some work that would become understood in due time.

Calling is a relationship. It is a blessing and changes our lives and empowers our existence. It can also be challenging. On one

From the Senior Warden

Let's play a word association: Easter ... rebirth ... spring ... *gardening!*

I love this time of the year. We have just come through the cold wet days of winter and the self-reflection and penitence of Lent. We have experienced the sadness and pain of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Then Easter morning greets us with joy, warmth, light, love, music, and flowers! It is a time of renewal and rebirth, a time when the horrific but beautiful story of our Savior's crucifixion, death, and resurrection combines with the frivolity of chocolate bunnies and Easter eggs (both derived from symbols of new life) to send us the message that we need not fear death, for it is not as final as it may seem. The Bible makes clear that it is the resurrection that paves the way for all believers to rise again to be united with Jesus in a resurrection like his. This promise of eternal life based on Jesus's example is the essence of our faith and the reason Easter is the most important holy day in the Christian calendar.

And all of nature joins in it. Vitality returns to the earth after the desolation of winter, with the arrival of long-awaited tulips, crocuses, and daffodils. It is when nature's cycle of life, death, and rebirth is most evident. Thus, Easter blends together with spring to teach us that death is not a terminal event, but rather a passageway into a new and greater life. As the days become longer and warmer, we find ourselves spending more time in the sunshine, focusing more on doing things with others, and investing more effort in self-renewal. Spring is a new beginning.

This spring the Church will be launching what I hope will be a long-running program in which we arrange for persons with expertise in a particular area to give a short talk at Redeemer on topics that

are of general interest to us and members of our community. Appropriately, our first topic will be "Gardening Tips from a Master Gardener," led by June Moore along with Louise Heizer. This will be an interactive class covering the basics of gardening through more advanced techniques for ensuring that our yards and gardens flourish and thrive, with plenty of time for questions.

Responses to the survey showed a strong preference for scheduling these gatherings with lunch on a Sunday followed by the speaker. So, everyone mark your calendar for a potluck "Lunch and Learn" in Purser Hall on **Sunday, May 20, beginning at 12:30.** The speaker part of the program will begin around 1:00 and should be done by 1:45. As an added bonus, everyone who attends will take home a free plant!

Please keep in mind that, while we believe these programs will be something that all of us will enjoy, we are hoping that folks will use it as an opportunity to invite friends or family to visit Redeemer. Guests are welcome to come worship with us at one of the services that day and then stick around for the Lunch and Learn, but they are free to join us just for the program if that is what they prefer.

We will likely schedule the next speaker for September, another for November or early December, and then continue on a quarterly basis in 2019. Other potential topics include:

- ◆ Cooking and entertaining tips from a professional caterer
- ◆ Time management techniques for busy parents
- ◆ Legal practicalities – wills, powers of attorney, living wills, and health care powers of attorney
- ◆ How to avoid internet scams and identity theft
- ◆ Recent breakthroughs in medicine and health care
- ◆ Gun safety and self-defense

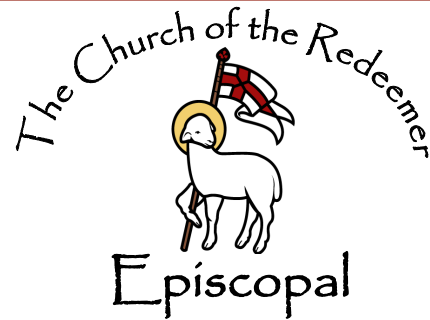

Church Safety

A message from the Vestry on church safety and security

In the wake of the recent shootings in other parts of our country, the Vestry has thoughtfully considered and discussed whether security measures at Redeemer should be enhanced. We believe that the risk is virtually non-existent that something will actually happen at our Church like what has occurred at schools and other churches, and we do not want to adopt security measures that would diminish our welcoming atmosphere to visitors and newcomers. However, we also want everyone who is attending services at the Church to feel safe and secure. Accordingly, the Vestry wants you to know that we are taking steps to improve security during services unobtrusively and without putting up barriers to those who wish to join us.

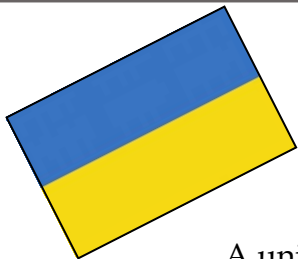

hand, God promises that he has created each of us for a part of his plan for the salvation of the world, telling us that, if we commit and promise to follow his risen Son, he will show us what needs to be done and will bless us in that work. On the other hand, he doesn't promise to use us how and where we want to be used. He only promises us that we will be used.

Some want to be used as a fellowship organizer bringing joy to the community, but God might say that he needs them in Godly Play helping our children know Jesus. Some desire to work in the garden, but God might need them at the door sharing a hug and a smile on Sunday morning before worship. God knows where he needs each of us according to his plan for this time and invites us into a relationship of following.

Two thousand years ago disciples traveled faithfully with Jesus. They went where he led and served as he asked. As they became the new church for the world, they listened to the Spirit for their continued direction. They followed and in that following, they found that it was the path to real joy.

Disciples today are on that same path. We go where Jesus leads and serve how Jesus asks. Each disciple here has been sent and placed at Redeemer with a mission to embrace and eventually complete. You are at Redeemer at God's direction and through your

faithfulness and God know where he is leading this church and what is needed to get it there. He calls some to leadership, and some to teaching, and others to caring for each other. He asks some to embrace worship, some to participate in fellowship, and other lead the way for all of us to serve the world beyond the door of the church building. Your call and your faithfulness and perseverance is critical for this time through a personal mission that should never be squandered.

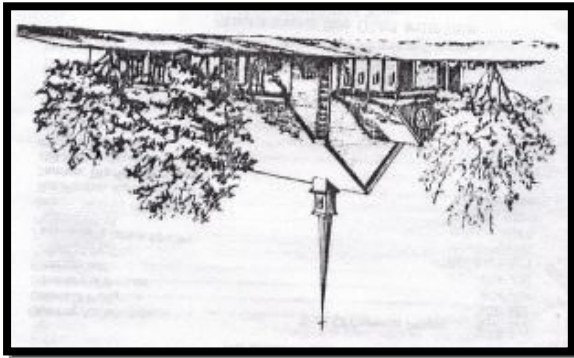
