From The Senior Warden

So what's next?

Up to now, our primary focus has been to make sure that we had a good parting of ways with Father Scott and Jane. We did that, and we did it exceedingly well. We said goodbye with love and joy, with positivity and affirmation, and with pride in Father Scott's path forward.

Now it is time to focus on our path forward. The Bishop has approved for us to begin our search for a new rector immediately, a reflection of his confidence in the condition of our parish. The Vestry is currently at work putting together a Search Committee. If you are interested, please let us know with just a short email or phone call to the church office or one of the Vestry members to say that you want to serve and briefly explain why.

Once the Search Committee has been formed, a three-step process begins. First, the position will be posted on the diocesan website for 30 days with a profile of our parish so that clergy who are interested in the position may contact the Bishop's office, which in turn forwards resumes to the Search Committee. Second, the Search Committee sifts through the resumes and decides which persons it wishes to follow up with through either telephone interviews or visits. The Search Committee will then select those it considers viable candidates and invite them to visit Redeemer. Finally, the Committee will present its recommendation to the Vestry. The Vestry makes the final decision and, with the Bishop's approval, issues the call.

The search process typically takes six to nine months, but it can be longer and sometimes is shorter. I ask for your patience and understanding as we work our way through it. Believe me, there is no one who wants more than I do to get this finished quickly, but there is no reason for us to be in a hurry. We are in a good position to take our time to find the right person.

In the meantime, we currently have Rev. Mark Moline, Rev. Tom Nicoll, and Rev. Kellie Wilson scheduled to be with us on Sundays through the middle of July, and we are hoping to arrange for clergy to cover the Wednesday services as well. The

Vestry is looking very hard at selecting one long-term supply priest to be with us throughout the entire interim period, in order to provide a sense of continuity during that time. We will keep you posted.

We are also determined not just to tread water while the search is underway. Our youth led two great services on Sunday, May 20, which was also Pentecost, and we had strong attendance at those services. That same day, Redeemer hosted its very first "Lunch and Learn," which was a success and which we will repeat (with a different topic) in a few months. We are staffing the Soup Kitchen on June 3, and at the end of June we will have our second annual Summer of Service ("SOS") for our youth, adults, and friends, learning about and providing help to organizations in Greenville that assist those in need in our community. The annual yard sale will be later, in August. Throughout the summer we will be sprucing up and refreshing the building and grounds, and we plan to have more frequent fellowship events so that we can come together more often.

For this same purpose – bringing all of us together – the Vestry has decided to try having one combined service at 9:30 am for the summer, starting June 10. This will be for the summer only, and will be done on an experimental basis. We want your feedback, and if it doesn't seem to be going over well, we can go back to our usual two services. The Vestry thinks, however, that the "8:30 crowd" and the "10:30 crowd" will enjoy mingling and getting to know each other a little better, and we feel that it is important for us all to be together more during this time.

We are embarking on a journey together, a voyage of discovery. I am excited to see what God has in store for us.
