From The Senior Warden

Wallace Lightsey

What is needed, what is important, and what is vital?

Sometimes it's hard to tell the difference, because something that is needed may be vitally important, even a necessity, but nonetheless may not be what gives a person or organization vitality.

I was reminded of this distinction recently. Over the previous several months, I had been intently focused on getting our buildings and grounds fixed up and spruced up. I felt that this was not just needed, but absolutely necessary. A number of people put in a huge amount of time and labor into the effort. The Vestry allocated funds to spend on it. And – you can see the results! Redeemer looks better now than it has in a good while, and at the Daughters of the King assembly on September 22, we received a lot of compliments on the appearance of the church.

This is important. It's important for our existing members to feel good about the physical environs at church. It's important for potential new members to see buildings and grounds that are cared for when they come to visit. We will continue to work on it.

But it's not what makes Redeemer spiritually vital and alive.

Last July most of us participated in a survey that is part of our rector search process. As you may or may not have noticed at the time, the survey is titled, "Congregational Vitality Survey." The organization that wrote the survey questions, compiled our responses, and provided us with its analysis of our responses, is part of an ongoing research project to assess the vitality of existing worship communities. In the course of drafting the survey, this organization reviewed prior research on congregational vitality and the results of a 2016 symposium. This process led it to distill seven marks of congregational vitality:

Lifelong discipleship formation – from the cradle to the grave, seeking to be formed for right living with God and all people

Intentional authentic evangelism – intentionally sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ, not just acts of kindness

Outward incarnational focus – exploration, awareness, and focus on our neighbors and neighborhood

Empowering servant leadership – identify, nurture, and support the use of spiritual gifts of all people to serve

Spirit-inspired worship – coming on holy ground to encounter God and experience wonder

Caring relationships – instead of a closed, judgmental community, people find freedom to share stories, encounter the Savior, and ask for help

Ecclesial health – clarity in mission, core values to ministry, passion and joy in being the church







Stewardship is a Spiritual Issue! We give not because God needs our money, but because it is good for us to give.


Stewardship is a FAITH issue! It is forward looking; a commitment to the future. It is God Trusting and Mission Centered.

Rector Search Update

On August 5, the search committee and vestry had a very productive meeting with the Transition Representative for the diocese, d'Rue Hazel. We gave her the parish information to post the rector position. Thanks to the vestry and members of the search committee for their proactive compilation of this important information.

The position has now been posted on the diocesan website and will remain there until September 28. In October the diocese will begin a preliminary screening of the candidates and forward the "good fit" priests to our search committee. Interviews here at Redeemer will begin soon after we receive them.

We are well on our way in the process of selection of a new rector. Please continue to pray for God's direction for all of us.




