## From The Rector

### *Grace Upon Grace*

November begins with All Saints Day and ends with Advent – beginnings and endings together. On All Saints Day, a major feast of the church, we remember all who have died. In addition, this is a preferred day for baptisms to take place. In the sacrament of baptism and in bodily death, we die to an old life and are raised to life in Jesus Christ. We hand our lives over to God, who gives us a life we cannot imagine. I am happy to say that Redeemer will have a baptism this All Saints Day! Kyle German will be baptized in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We will use our new copper baptismal font insert; copper having been recommended because of its antimicrobial properties. Be sure to sign up for Sunday worship for All Saints Day!

The first Sunday of Advent this year is November 29<sup>th</sup>. We enter new life on this day in the form of a new liturgical (worship) year. Our Sunday readings will come from Year B of our 3-year cycle of readings; in year B we focus on the gospel of Mark. The bible passages we use for worship come from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), and we join Anglican, Baptist, Episcopal, Lutheran, Methodist, Presbyterian, Reformed, Roman Catholic and other churches worldwide in reading the same bible passages each Sunday. On November 29 we'll say "Happy New Year!"

Of course, before a new year we have a new year's eve; for Sunday worship, our new year's eve is November 22, and on this final Sunday of the liturgical year we celebrate the Reign of Christ. This Sunday is often called Christ the King day. In worship life at Redeemer, we remember Jesus' words to feed his sheep. With a beautiful display of autumn abundance, parishioners of Redeemer offer gifts to Samaritan House, which does indeed feed God's people in Greenville. We give thanks for the ability to give to others out of our abundance.

We have so much for which to pray this November: all the saints; the presidential election; our many blessings, expressed through the United Thank Offering; our first "virtual" diocesan convention; the Reign of Christ and an abundant harvest; for relief from and a vaccine for Covid-19. Keep praying, dear friends. The world needs to see Christian hope in thought, word, and deed. From a recent Collect:

*Lord, we pray that your grace may always precede and follow us, that we may continually be given to good works; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.*

God's grace is upon us, before us, and behind us. Thanks be to God!

### LIFT A FINGER

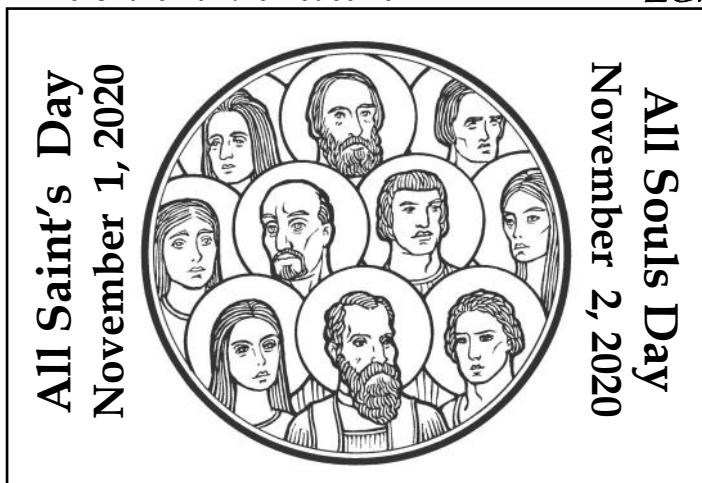


Most of us are familiar with the above portion of a fresco painted by Michelangelo. It depicts God's hand with lifted finger on the right reaching out to Adam's hand on the left. On the surface it appears to be simply an action in the midst of the creation of Adam, however lots has been written about the underlying symbolism of the painting. One interpretation I find both comforting yet a reality check is that despite God's miraculous offer made to each of us, we struggle in our day-to-day lives to fully take his hand. Note above the outstretched, determined hand and finger of God vs. the tentative, somewhat lackadaisical hand and finger of Adam.

We are told the struggles of life are meant to be and give us perspective about what's important. 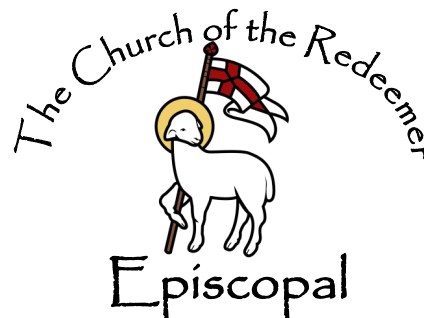

## Congregation Call-in Activity Report

With the “new normal” created by the worldwide pandemic of COVID-19, most of us have become accustomed to communicating online. But there’s just no substitute for a direct conversation between two people! Recognizing this, the Vestry, during its August meeting, asked the Membership Committee, to organize such an effort. By the end of August the Membership Committee, had started creating lists for the Vestry members to contact. Then over the next six weeks, the vestry set out to contact everyone in our church family by phone. We wanted to hear how everyone was doing, to learn news of our members and to ensure all knew how to participate in Redeemer services and activities during this unusual time.

Vestry members were successful in speaking with someone in about 53% of the calls attempted. And without exception, those who were reached appreciated the call.

Here’s a summary of what was learned:

Overall, our church family is healthy and doing well. One family will be welcoming a new baby! Others have students in college.

- ◆ Some members shared stories of upcoming knee surgeries and health concerns. Others, because of underlying health conditions or other reasons, are concerned as to when they will feel comfortable returning to in person church services.
- ◆ Many have loved the outside services and say they were a good alternative, with one person commenting that they “love at least being able to be in-person for worship. Grateful for at

least that.” Many echoed the sentiment that outside services are “good while we’re holding out until we can all get back together in the church.” Some follow services of Redeemer online and/or access the National Cathedral’s Sunday services.

- ◆ Several in the congregation cannot follow online services because they do not have internet access or a computer. These church family members particularly appreciated the call and look forward to more calls throughout the year. Plus they enjoy receiving the weekly bulletin and sermons in printed form from Sue Bannio.
- ◆ Almost everyone contacted is receiving *Echoes*, some access the Sunday bulletin via the church website, some mentioned Daughters of the King and calls from Reverend Catherine.
- ◆ Some mentioned how impressed they were with how quickly the church started video recording services to be accessible on the internet and also started holding outdoor services once the Bishop provided the necessary guidelines to be followed.
- ◆ Many in the congregation commented that Reverend Catherine is doing a good job.
- ◆ Many miss the choir and congregation singing.

The vestry appreciates the opportunity to speak with members of the congregation. ### Have you considered automating your pledge payments to Redeemer?

As we approach the beginning of Advent at the end of the month, I am reminded of the fire that threatened our sanctuary eight years ago. We were so fortunate to extinguish the flames before they did damage to the structure of the church, especially the altar.

Our thin altar cloth that covers altar linens during the week has tiny holes in it...a reminder of the fire embers that fell on it. I look at these holes as little miracles. Our altar, and the Cerecloth and Fair Linen over it, were not touched. Our altar was protected by a piece of thin sheeting material and our prayers that acted as a barrier from the fire. ## Worship Update

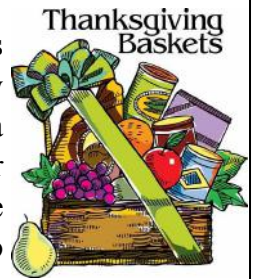



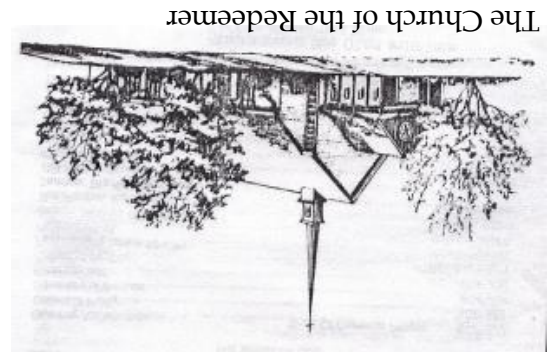
