


Lenten Studies

Redeemer is offering two educational offerings during the season of Lent. Prayerfully consider making these classes part of your Lenten study and discipline.

On Tuesday nights (after soup supper), we are looking at Holy Week in videos and a book. Each week has a theme about what Jesus was risking each day between Palm Sunday and Good Friday. Jesus risks: humiliation, temptation, losing his friends – all part of his humanity. There is a book available for this study.

Our Sunday Christian Education offering is a workbook devotional: God is Still With Us. We are looking at characteristics of being human: to be human is to be vulnerable, not to know it all, etc. Each week's devotion for the study is based on bible verses.

Worship in Lent:

The season of Lent is a penitential one, meaning that we have a set aside time in which to look at our lives and to say "I'm sorry" for the ways in which we have stepped away from our relationship with God, others, and ourselves. We begin the season by hearing The Ten Commandments. All during Lent we say our confession at the beginning of the service. We close Lenten services with a solemn bow and prayer to God.
