

We are in the season of Lent, in which we are invited "to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word" (BCP, p. 265). Worship looks and sounds different in this season: the color used in worship is purple, we save our "alleluias" until Easter, and even the music sounds a little more somber. Lent is not, however, a time of sorrow; rather, it is a time of examining our life our faith, and of the deep joy found in following Jesus anew and living more faithfully to what God would have us do. We join one another in a Holy Lent.
