There is a church in New Zealand that made some widely-shared videos for the Christmas season. One of the videos is titled "They Won't be Expecting That," which tells the story of our Savior coming to us as a baby – "they won't be expecting that!" The actors are children, and it is delightful to watch them tell the story of Jesus' birth. We might not expect the story to be told in that way, either.

I keep thinking about the many events in our lives that do not happen in the way we expect. Who would have expected an ice storm followed by a snowstorm in the South, when much of the country remained dry? At the same time there are households in MS that will be without power for several weeks; nature hit hard there. Mississippians weren't expecting that.

I doubt that they anticipated over fifty people showing up at a neighborhood meeting that encouraged them to go forward. A year later The Church of the Redeemer was not only gathering but had broken ground on a building. Seventy-five years later, we are a strong faith community. As you turn the pages of this month's Echoes newsletter, you might be surprised at how much Redeemer does not only here but in and for the community around us and across the world. Who would have expected that?

It is time to give thanks for all that we have and all that we do and to continue to seek God's guidance for our present and future. The neighborhood needs our active witness; the world desperately needs the unity and hope that is grounded in Christ Jesus. The Holy Spirit is active here; you can feel the Spirit's presence in the nave, in our meetings, in the many ways in which we gather. Miracle Hill and Sammy's Mission

Toiletry items and other small gifts were collected for two local men's addiction recovery programs. Items for Miracle Hill were purchased online and sent to their facility to be sorted and given out in time for Christmas. *Miracle Hill* is a household name that has been serving and doing wonderful things locally for over 85 years!

Sammy's Mission, founded in 2021, has seven transitional houses in Greenville. They provide a safe, sober, Christ-centered environment for men in active recovery from substance abuse. On December 17th, a few elves were busy in the transept stuffing Christmas bags with treasured items for each of the 41 men in the program. Each bag not only contained toiletry items, but also a toboggan, warm socks, and a hand-written Christmas card from church members. Cleaning items and sweet treats were also collected and were greatly appreciated. Later that day, an employee from Sammy's Mission showed up in a pick-up truck to load up the gifts. He shared that he is also in recovery and lives in one of the homes. A powerful and precious gift came from such a chance conversation that day. God is so good! He shows us that what we think is a call to fill material "things" can become an even bigger blessing to us!

A Happy Day: Christmas Joy in Santiago, Chile

This Christmas was truly a *Happy Day* for the youth we serve in four government-run group homes in Santiago, Chile. Thanks to your generous support, we were able to celebrate the birth of Jesus together on December 20th in ways that reflected family, joy, and the love of Christ.

Each home celebrated with a shared meal, Christ-centered reflections on the Christmas story, and meaningful activities led by volunteers who walk consistently with the youth throughout the year. In the girls' homes, each young person received a personalized gift chosen with her interests and personality in mind. In the boys' homes, the youth requested shared gifts, and each home received a ping pong table, creating space for connection, laughter, and healthy community.

In total, **75 youth**, including girls, boys, and young adults who have aged out of the system but remain connected, received Christmas gifts as a tangible reminder that they are seen, known, and deeply valued. In addition, **110 caregivers** and **25 volunteers** received small gifts and handwritten Christmas cards as a thank-you for their dedication and commitment.

Because of this generosity, Christmas truly became a *Happy Day*—a day where the good news of Jesus was not only heard, but experienced through love, presence, and belonging.

I pray that God will let people know and feel that He sees their pain and suffering. I know people who God sends to these people.

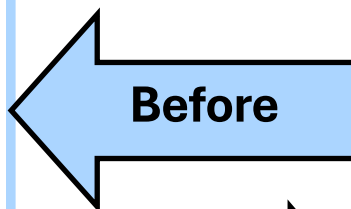

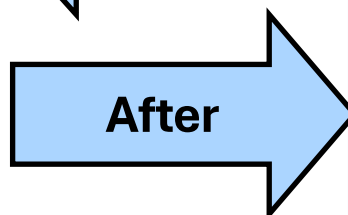
